Sub: Terms and Conditions regarding fixation of fee structure for the Academic Years 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 for Postgraduate Medical and Dental Courses.

1. The Fee Regulatory Committee (Medical) (here in after referred to as The Committee) has been constituted under section-9 of **The Gujarat Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fixation of Fees) Act, 2007, Act No. 3 of 2008** (hereinafter referred to as 'The Act') enacted by the State Government to make special provision, inter-alia, for fixation of fees in professional medical educational colleges or institutions for admission of students. Hence, the Committee is empowered to determine the fee structure for Medical, Dental, Physiotherapy, Homoeopathy, Ayurveda, Optometry, Occupational Therapy, Orthotics and Nursing program in unaided professional colleges/institutions in the State as these institutions fall within the purview of the Act and they are subject to the jurisdiction of the Committee.
2. In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it u/s 10(2) of the Act, the Committee invited the proposals of fee structure with required audited accounts and other details from the institutions vide letter dated 15/12/2020.
3. The Committee carried out the scrutiny of the record and books of accounts submitted by management of the Institutions. Based on the preliminary scrutiny and analysis of the details furnished to it, the Committee evaluated the facilities, infrastructure, capital investment made by the institutions, plans for development on hand and for future, compliance of requirements concerning the staff, cost estimates etc. for the purpose of fixing the fee structure for the institutions.
4. Further, in accordance with provisions of section-11 of the Act, while determining and fixing the fees to be charged by the institutions, the Committee also kept in view the relevant factors as prescribed u/s 11 of the Act. The Committee, However, makes it clear that the colleges/institutions can devise a fee structure, if the circumstances so warrant, providing differential fee for different degree/diploma courses, provided the average of the fees, charged from all the students is maintained at par with the fee structure determined by the committee.



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5. Thus the Committee has fully considered the facts and figures as also the factors essential for determination of fee structure for each institution and only thereafter by following the Standard Operational Procedure for fee fixation, it has determined the fee structures of the institutions as per Fee Orders. However due to pandemic condition and in particular second and third wave of COVID-19 Committee's exercise of determining fee structure of more than 700 institutions got delayed. Hence due to paucity of time the committee has not been able to pass separate order for each institution but it has made common order category-wise.

6. While determining the fee structures of the institutions the committee has kept in view the hardship caused to students/parents due to circumstances that were prevailing in the recent past and to some extent currently also. It is a matter of common knowledge that COVID-19 pandemic has caused disastrous effect on the economy world wide and thrown it in to complete disarray causing enormous difficulties in day to day life of all the sections of the society. Our country is not spread of it and though the pandemic is on decline for the present, the adverse impact it has caused on the country's economy still continuous. With the income dwindling, the parents of the students find it difficult to discharge their obligation to pay the tuition fees of their children. Even during year 2020-21 and subsequently, to avail online education for their children, the parents had to incur additional expenditure to create minimum facilities which included purchase of smart phone or in a given case even laptop and arrange for network connectivity through purchase of additional data plan. As against that the students were deprived of all other facilities such as high tech classroom, well equipped laboratories, library with good collection of books and journals on various subjects, faculty consultation etc. As a result of all this students education has suffered to considerable extent.

In other word during lock down and even for considerable period thereafter i.e. till first quarter of this year there was no imparting of education in physical presence of the students as the pandemic condition prevailing then in the country did not warrant reopening of the institutions. The education imparted to the students was by E-learning mode. This has resulted in to reduction in cost of electricity, laboratories materials, library and other like facilities as reflected from the data furnished by the institutions. Thus even after payment of full fees what the students received was only online education which is not adequate and equally efficacious alternative of class room learning. At the same time un-utilization of other facilities by the students has benefited the institutions monetarily to certain extent.

7. The fees indicated in **Fee Order** include all types and kinds of fees such as Tuition Fee, Clinical, Library, Laboratory, Computer Centre, Caution Money, Gymkhana, Internet, Sports and Recreation



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and Self / Personality Centers etc except Hostel fee , Enrollment Fee, Examination Fee and Transportation fee. The colleges/institutions are advised not to collect any other fee from the students except the fees as mentioned in **Fee Order**. Any such unauthorized collection of fee may invite punitive action as per the law.

8. For the present block of three years viz. 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24, different Fee Structures are determined for 75% of government seats as well as 25% of management seats.
9. It is made clear that if any management seats remain vacant or any institution surrenders the management seats to the Government for admission, in that case fee would be at par with the government seats.
10. The fee structure determined by this Committee shall be binding for the years 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24. The fees so determined shall be applicable to only new students admitted in that specific academic year and shall not be revised till the completion of their professional course in that college or institution i.e. (1) the students admitted in the year 2021-22, the fees of 2021-22 are applicable to them up to the completion of their course (2) the students admitted in the year 2022-23, the fees of 2022-23 will be applicable to them up to the completion of their course (3) the students admitted in the year 2023-24, the fees of 2023-24 will be applicable to them to the completion of their course.
11. Each College/Institution is also advised to comply with following additional conditions:
 - a. It shall not take fees for the full course at the time of admission. The fees should be collected per semester / term of 6 (Six) months as the case may be.
 - b. It shall not ask for any bank guarantee or security of any kind from students or their parents.
 - c. It shall not force on the students, any facility including hostel and transport as part of the condition for admission or its continuity till the end of the full tenure of the course.
 - d. It shall notify the fee structure on the College Notice Board and display copy of this order on its Mandatory Disclosure Link on its web site.
 - e. It will be free to fix fees for NRI students up to 15 % of the intake capacity subject to intimation of the same to the Committee. The difference of amount of the fees from the



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NRI category students and Management students shall be used by it for providing scholarship to the students and/or increasing infrastructure facilities. It shall also furnish all the information pertaining to the utilization of excess fees from the NRI category students as per the Information Memorandum submitted by it to the Fee Regulatory Committee in the next block of three years.

12. This order has been made under section 10 of the Act hence violation of any of the provision contained in it will render the management of the institution liable to be proceeded against under penal provisions of the Act.
