NO. GP- 13 -MCG-1008-931-J:- In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 20 read with section 4 of the Gujarat Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fixation of Fees) Act, 2007 (Guj. 3 of 2008), the Government of Gujarat hereby makes the following rules to regulate admission to the first year of the Professional Medical Educational Colleges' or Institutions' Courses and payment of fees, namely:-

1. **Short Title and Commencement.-** These rules may be called the Gujarat Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Payment of Fees) Rules, 2008.
2. **Definitions.-** (1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) “Act” means the Gujarat Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Fixation of Fees) Act, 2007 (Guj. 3 of 2008);
 - (b) “admission” for the purpose of these rules means admission of students in the first year of the degree in Professional Medical Educational Courses;
 - (c) “Consortium” means an association of professional colleges or institutions formed to facilitate admission to management seats of such institutions;
 - (d) “Gujarat Board” means the Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary School Examination Board established under section 3 of the Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary School Board Act, 1972 (Guj.18 of 1973);
 - (e) “B-group” means the group comprises the subjects of Biology, Physics and Chemistry in the Science Stream of the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (Standard XII, 10+2 pattern);
 - (f) “AB-group” means the group comprises the subjects of Mathematics, Biology, Physics, and Chemistry in the Science Stream of the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination (Standard XII, 10+2 pattern);
 - (g) “Professional Medical Educational Courses” for the purposes of these rules, Professional Medical Educational Courses means the Degree Courses in Medicine, Dentistry, Ayurved, Homeopathy, Physiotherapy, Nursing, Orthotic, Optometry, Occupational therapy, Naturopathy in the Professional Educational Colleges or Institutions of the State;
 - (h) “Gujarat Common Entrance Test (GUJCET)” means the common entrance test conducted by the Gujarat Board for the purpose of admissions to the professional courses;
 - (i) “Qualifying Examination” means the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination, (Standard XII, 10+2 pattern) passed in the Science Stream or equivalent examination.

(2) The words and expressions used in these rules but not defined shall have the same meanings as assigned to them in the Act.
3. **Admissions to Professional Medical Educational Courses.-** Admissions to the First Year of the Professional Medical Educational Courses shall be given as under, namely:-
 - (1) all the Government Seats shall be filled on the basis of merit list prepared by the Admission Committee constituted under section 4 of the Act for admissions to the First Year of the Professional Medical Educational Courses.

- (2) all the Management Seats shall be filled by the management of the respective Professional Educational College or Institution, on the basis of *inter-se* merit list of the students to be admitted against the management seats and whose names appear in the merit list prepared by the Admission Committee:

Provided that where any management seat remains vacant, such seat shall be filled in from the Government seats.

- (3) all the Non-Resident Indian Seats shall be filled by the management of the respective Professional Educational College or Institution, on the basis of *inter-se* merit list of the students to be admitted against the Non-Resident Indian seats.

Provided that where any Non-Resident Indian seat remains vacant, such seat shall be filled in from the management seats.

4. **Seats Available for Admission.-** For the purpose of admission to the first year Professional Medical Educational Courses, available seats shall include,-

A. Government Seats.- (1) All the sanctioned seats of the Professional Medical Educational Courses in the Government Colleges or Institutions of the State,

(2) All the sanctioned seats of the Professional Medical Educational Courses in the aided Colleges or Institutions, and

(3) Seventy-five percent of the total sanctioned seats of the Professional Medical Educational Courses in the unaided Colleges or Institutions.

B. Management Seats.- (1) Twenty-five percent seats of the total sanctioned seats of the Professional Medical Educational Courses in the unaided Colleges or Institutions of the State including fifteen per cent Non Resident Indian seats;

(2) The intimation received, in respect of sanction of seats, by the Admission Committee three days prior to the commencement of the first counseling program, shall be considered as available seats.

(3) Before commencement of admission process, if any unaided College or Institution requests to fill up the Management Seats by the Admission Committee, such Management Seats shall also be considered as available for giving admissions.

C. Non-Resident Indian Seats-(1) Fifteen percent seats of the total sanctioned seats of the Professional Medical Educational Courses in the Colleges or Institutions of the State.

(2) The intimation received, in respect of sanction of seats, by the Admission Committee three days prior to the commencement of the first counseling program, shall be considered as available seats.

5. **Eligibility for Admission.-** (1) For the purpose of admission, a candidate shall have passed with “B-group” or “AB-group” the qualifying examination from,-

(i) the Gujarat Board; or

(ii) the Central Board of Secondary Education Board provided that the school in which the candidate has studied, should have been located in the State of Gujarat; or

(iii) the Council of Indian School Certificate Examinations, New Delhi Board provided that the school in which the candidate has studied should have been located in the State of Gujarat; and

(iv) appeared in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test conducted in the current academic year,

(v) Sanskrit is compulsory either in 10th or 12th science for candidate seeking admission in Ayurved.

- (2) Sons and Daughters of All India Services Officers viz. Indian Administrative Service, Indian Police Service and Indian Forest Service allotted to the Gujarat State and serving outside the Gujarat State on deputation shall be treated at par

with the candidates under sub- rule (1), provided they have passed the qualifying examination from any other board and he/she must have appeared in the GUJCET Examination. In such cases, State board candidates shall be included in state merit list & Candidates of central board/council shall be included in central board merit list.

- (3) Sons and daughters of Gujarat Government Employees who have been posted outside Gujarat State for the administrative reasons shall also be covered under category 5(2) above.
- (4) A candidate who has,-
 - (i) studied under Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme upto Standard VIII in any of the schools located in the State of Gujarat,
 - (ii) thereafter studied in any of the schools located out of the State of Gujarat under the said scheme,
 - (iii) passed qualifying examination from a Navodaya Vidyalay located outside Gujarat State and
 - (iv) appeared in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test conducted in the current academic year shall be eligible for admission and his candidature shall be included in the second merit list as prescribed in clause (b) of sub-rule (2) of rule 11.

Explanation.- “Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme” means the Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya scheme started during the year 1985-86 by the Government of India in accordance with the National Policy of Education. The scheme is managed by Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti, an autonomous organization under the department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development.

- (5) A candidate who has passed the qualifying examination after appearing in the supplementary examination conducted by the Board shall not be eligible for admission in the current academic year.
- (6) A candidate who has secured admission under these rules in any year shall not be eligible for further admission to any course until the period within which he might have completed the course in which he has secured admission.

6. Eligibility Criteria –

A. For Government Seats:-

- (1) Students shall be of Indian Nationality
- (2) Candidate shall have completed 17 yrs of Age on 31st December of the Academic Year for which the admissions are being conducted:

Provided that in case of under age students his/her admission shall be granted at the time of counseling but his/her academic term shall start from the day when he/she completes 17 years of age and his/her term in the concerned Professional Educational College or Institution shall commence after completion of eligible age.

- (3) Students shall meet minimum qualifying standards for admission as prescribed under these Rules.

B. For Management Seats :-

- (1) Students shall be of Indian Nationality
- (2) Candidate shall have completed 17 yrs of Age on 31st December of the Academic Year for which the admissions are being conducted:

Provided that in case of under age students his/her admission shall be granted at the time of counseling but his/her academic term shall start from the day when he/she completes 17 years of age and his/her term in the concerned Professional Educational College or Institution shall commence after completion of eligible age.

- (3) Students shall meet minimum qualifying standards for admission as prescribed under these Rules.

C. For Non-Resident Indian Seats :-

- (1) Students should be Non-Resident Indian or wards or the dependents of the Non-Resident Indians for the education purpose .
- (2) Candidate should have completed 17 yrs of Age on 31st December of the Academic Year for which the admissions are being conducted.

Provided that in case of under age students his/her admission shall be granted at the time of counseling but his/her academic term shall start from the day when he/she completes 17 years of age and his/her term in the concerned Professional Educational College or Institution will commence after completion of eligible age.

7. Admissions to-

The admission to students in the Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions shall be given in the following manner, namely,:-

A. Government Seats:-

- (1) The Admission Committee shall, by advertisement in the prominent news papers widely circulated in the State, and by such other means, as the Committee may consider convenient, publish the date of issue of application forms, centres from where the application forms may be obtained and to where submitted, last date for submission of application forms and such other information as may be necessary in this behalf.
- (2) The Government seats to be filled by the Admission Committee shall be on the basis of inter-se merit list of the students, who have applied, to be admitted against the Government seats:

Provided that no student shall be admitted against the Government seats unless his / her name appears in the merit list prepared by the Admission Committee;

- (3) No vacant seat in any Medical, Dental, Nursing College will be filled up after 30th September.
- (4) No vacant seat in any Physiotherapy / Ayurved /Homeopathy / Orthotics / Naturopathy / Occupational Therapy / Optometry college will be filled up after 31st October.

B. Management Seats:-

- (1) The College or Institution individually or in consortium shall issue an advertisement in two English and two Gujarati leading news papers inviting applications with details of fees to be paid and eligibility criteria and numbers of seats available for admission on the management seats.
- (2) The management seats to be filled in by the management of the respective Professional Medical Educational College or Institution shall be on the basis of inter-se merit list of the students, who have applied, to be admitted against the management seats:

Provided that no student shall be admitted against the management seats unless his / her name appears in the merit list prepared by the Admission Committee;

Provided further that where any Non-Resident Indian seat remains vacant, such seat shall be converted into management seats and filled in from the merit list for management seats ;

Provided also that where any management seat remains vacant, on 20th September for Medical, Dental and Nursing and 20th October for all other courses, shall be filled in from the merit list for Government seats;

- (3) If any of the statements made in the application form or any information / document supplied by the candidate in connection with his / her application or admission is at any time found to be false or incorrect or misleading, or if at any time it is found that the candidate has concealed any information / fact in connection with his / her application his/her admission shall be cancelled without any notice thereof, fees shall be forfeited and he / she may be expelled.

C. Non-Resident Indian Seats :-

- (1) The College or Institution shall issue advertisement in two English and two Gujarati leading news papers inviting applications with details of the fees to be paid, eligibility criteria and number of seats available in Non-Resident Indian seats.
- (2) Candidates shall provide necessary documentary evidence of proof showing Non-Resident Indian Status of his own or parents or guardian of the wards or the person of whom he is dependent (for the education purpose).
- (3) Candidates passing qualifying examination from abroad, shall have to produce equivalence certificate from the Gujarat Higher Secondary Education Board, Gandhinagar / Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi.
- (4) The Non-Resident Indian seats to be filled in by the management of the respective Professional Medical Educational College or Institution shall be on the basis of inter-se merit list of the students, who have applied, to be admitted against the Non-Resident Indian seats:

8. Reservation of Seats.- (1) For the purpose of admission, the seats shall be reserved for the candidate who are origin of Gujarat and falling under the following categories, namely:-

- (2) A candidate seeking admission on reserved seat shall be required to produce a Certificate of caste from which he originates:

Provided that the candidate belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Class shall be required to produce a certificate to the effect of non-inclusion in Creamy Layer in addition to the caste certificate.

- (3) No caste certificate shall be valid unless it is duly stamped, signed and issued by the authority empowered by the Government of Gujarat.
- (4) No certificate to the effect of non-inclusion in Creamy Layer shall be valid, unless it is duly stamped, signed and issued by the authority empowered by the Government of Gujarat. Such certificate shall have been issued on or after the 1st April of the academic year in which the candidate is seeking admission.
- (5) If a candidate fails to submit the certificates as required under sub-rule (2) within the stipulated time, his candidature shall be considered for admission under unreserved category.
- (6) If a candidate of reserved category gets admission on unreserved seat in order of merits, he may be given admission on the unreserved seat according to his preference.
- (7) The admission of a student of a reserved category on a reserved seat shall be valid subject to the verification of cast certificate by the authority empowered by the State Government in this behalf. In case the caste certificate is found invalid on verification, he shall not have right to claim his admission on reserved seat and if he has been already granted admission, such admission shall be cancelled.
- (8) After granting admission to all the students of reserved categories on reserved seats, the reserved category seats remaining vacant shall be transferred to the unreserved category seats.

9. Reservation For Physically Disabled Candidates.- Three percent of the available seats in each category shall be reserved, for loco-motor disabled candidates of the respective category provided that a candidate having " loco-motor disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% (upper limbs being normal)" shall be eligible to apply for admission to

the course subject to the certificate obtained as per the Proforma annexed to the application form to that effect from medical board constituted for the purpose regarding disability and suitability of such candidate for undertaking the course shall be treated as final.

10. **Distribution of Seats between Students of Gujarat Board and Other Boards.**- For the purpose of admission, the available seats shall be distributed between students of the Gujarat Board and other Boards on *pro-rata* basis, taking into consideration the number of students passed from the Gujarat Board and other Boards, in the relative academic year.
11. **Preparation of Merit List for admission**- The merit list of the candidates who have applied for admission in the prescribed form, within the prescribed time limit and who are found eligible for admission under these rules, shall be prepared in the following manner, namely:-
 - (1) (a) The candidates who have passed qualifying examination from the Gujarat Board, sixty percent of marks obtained from total 300 marks in theory of the Physics, Biology and Chemistry subjects combined with the forty percent of marks obtained from the total 120 marks in the Physics, Biology and Chemistry subjects in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test (GUJCET), shall be the merit marks.
 - (b) The candidates who have passed qualifying examination from other Boards, sixty percent of marks obtained, in theory of the Physics, Biology and Chemistry subjects from total 210 marks combined with the forty percent of marks obtained from the total 120 marks in the Physics, Biology and Chemistry subjects in the Gujarat Common Entrance Test (GUJCET), shall be the merit marks.
- (2) The Admission Committee shall prepare and publish two separate merit lists, namely:-
 - (a) The first merit list shall include the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from the Gujarat Board. Merit list of reserved category candidates shall be prepared separately.
 - (b) The second merit list shall include the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from the other Boards. Merit list of reserved category candidates shall be prepared separately.
- (3) The criteria for deciding merit order in case of students having equal merit marks shall be in the following sequence, namely:-
 - (a) Candidates whose marks obtained in Biology at GUJ-CET are higher should be placed higher.
 - (b) After application of clause (a), if the candidates still have equal marks, merit order should be determined on the basis of marks obtained in English at the qualifying examination.
 - (c) After application of clause (b), if the candidates still have equal marks, merit order should be determined on basis of total marks obtained in theory of Science subjects (viz. Physics, Chemistry & Biology) in the qualifying examination.
 - (d) After application of clause (c), if the candidates still have equal marks, Merit order should be determined on basis of percentage of marks obtained in the 10th standard examination.
 - (e) After application clause (d), if the candidates still have equal marks then merit order should be determined on the basis of Birth Date. Priority will be given to a candidate who is senior in age.
- (4) Some of the Professional Medical Educational Courses as may be decided by the Admission Committee in consultation with the Government, will be exempted from any entrance test.

- 12. Minimum qualifying standard for admission. (1)** No students shall be admitted in the professional medical educational course unless he / she fulfills the eligibility criteria, including the minimum qualifying marks (standard) .
- (2) The minimum qualifying standard for admission shall be notified by the State Government by order in the *Official Gazette* from time to time.
- 13. Last dates for Admissions :**(1) No vacant seat in any Medical, Dental, Nursing College will be filled up after the 30th September.
- (2) No vacant seat in any Physiotherapy / Ayurved /Homeopathy / Orthotics/ Optometry/Occupational therapy / naturopathy college will be filled in after 31st October. This will also be applicable for both Management Seats and Non-Resident Indian Seats.
- 14. Correction of Marks. –(1)** In case of change in marks of a student in the qualifying examination, such student shall produce a letter to that effect or the corrected mark sheet issued by the Board, before the Admission Committee at least one day before the commencement of admission process (counseling program) but not later than seven days from the receipt of letter, or as the case may be, corrected mark-sheet. In such case he shall be placed at an appropriate order in the merit list.
- (2) The student who was declared failed initially in the qualifying examination, but later on declared passed after rechecking of marks by the Board, such student shall, notwithstanding any time limit prescribed, be allowed to apply for the admission provided he produces a letter to that effect or the corrected mark sheet issued by the Board, within seven days of the receipt of letter, or as the case may be, corrected mark-sheet.
- 15. Application for admission.- (1)** For the purpose of admission, a candidate shall apply, within the time limit specified by the Admission Committee, in the prescribed form as shown in Appendix appended to these rules.
- (2) The application form for admission can be obtained from the centers as may be notified by the Admission Committee, on payment of a sum as may be determined by the Admission Committee, from time to time.
- (3) Where a candidate has made more than one application, the application made at the later stage shall be taken into consideration for admission and the other applications shall be treated as cancelled.
- (4) The application form duly filled, shall be submitted by the candidate, in person, at the notified centers referred to in sub-rule [2], along with the self-attested copies of the certificates and testimonies, as specified in the application form. A receipt for the same shall be given by such person as may be authorized by the Admission Committee.
- (5) The Admission Committee shall, by advertisement in the prominent news papers widely circulated in the State, and by such other means, as the Committee may consider convenient, published the date of issue of application forms, centres from where the application forms may be obtained and to where submitted, last date for submission of application forms and such other information as may be necessary in this behalf.
- 16. Admission Procedure.- (1) (a)** A Candidate seeking admission to Management and Non Resident Indian Seats in any Professional Educational College or Institution must submit application in the prescribed form, duly filled in, to the Dean of the respective College or Institution.
- (b) A candidate seeking admission to Government seats must submit their application form to the Admission Committee of the State. Admission to these seats will be made by the Admission Committee of the State as per the rules published by the State Government for the Admission to the Professional Medical Educational Courses.

- (2) All the applicants who have submitted their application as per sub-rule (1) within the prescribed time limit in the form will be issued receipt by the respective college or institution or as the case may be the Admission Committee. The applicant shall be given registration number and date of his/her application in the receipt. The registration number so given will be used as reference in all future correspondence and also while publishing merit list and admission.
- (3) All the original certificates shall be produced by the candidates for verification before the admitting authorities at the time of counseling. Certificates produced after counseling will not ordinarily be accepted.
- (4) Every student seeking admission to Professional Medical Educational College or Institution, should submit a Certificate of Physical fitness to undergo the course in the prescribed form from a registered medical practitioner. This certificate is to be submitted, at the time of joining the college to the Dean/Principal of the respective College to which the candidate has been offered admission.
- (5) The respective college shall publish the merit list on its notice board and website of the College. The eligible candidates will also be informed individually by post (for first counseling only) instructing them to remain present on a specified date and to pay the one term fees on the same day. Those who fail to report on the specified date and time either in person or by a duly authorized representative and do not pay the fees on the same day will be deemed to have forfeited the claim for admission in that counseling only. The candidates called for counseling should mark their presence before going for counseling.
- (6) At the time of subsequent counseling or reshuffling individual call letters will not be sent but candidates will be instructed to remain present on specific date, time and place by public advertisement in leading daily news papers of the State. Those who fail to report on the specified date and time either in person or by a duly authorized representative and do not pay the fees on the same day will be deemed to have forfeited the claim for admission in that counseling.
- (7) In case the candidate is unable to remain present personally, on the date, time and place of counseling, due to serious illness, accident or unavoidable circumstances, his parents or guardian shall, after obtaining prior approval of the Admission Committee or any officer authorized by the Committee, remain present on the scheduled date, time and place. An authority letter signed by the candidate showing his order of preference and choice of branches and Colleges or Institutions shall have to be produced by the parents or guardian who shall remain present in his behalf, along with the documentary evidence showing reason for the absence or inability to remain present personally.
- (8) After getting admission the candidate shall, within a period of seven working days, report to his respective College or Institution. In case the candidate fails to get himself registered, within the time limit, the admission granted shall be treated as cancelled.
- (9) In case the candidate fails to get himself registered, within the time limit due to unavoidable circumstances, the candidate shall, after obtaining prior approval of the Admission Committee or any officer authorized by the Committee within three days after the expiry of the time limit, produce documentary evidence showing reason for such failure. If the Admission Committee is satisfied, it may grant him further period of not more than three days to report to the College or Institution for the purpose of registration.
- (10) In case the candidate does not remain present for counseling for the purpose of admission at the scheduled date and time and approaches the Admission Committee on later date, with an application in writing, to allow him for admission, he may be permitted for counseling and granted admission, in the branch, College or Institution and in the respective category available at such later date. He shall have no right to claim for the admission in the branch, College or Institution and in the respective category available on the scheduled date and time.

- (11) The candidate belonging to reserved category may be allowed to remain present at the scheduled date and time of counseling for admission of the candidates of unreserved category, as per his merit number in the unreserved category. The admission shall be granted to such candidate in unreserved category, only if he is eligible to get admission, in the higher order of preference of courses than that in the reserved category.
- (12) In case, where considerable number of seats fall vacant, and it appears to the Admission Committee to fill the vacant seats, it may conduct the admission process for readjustment (reshuffling) of seats for his / her options than the options available to the candidate during the previous counseling. In such readjustment (reshuffling) of seats, the candidate who opts for the available higher option, he shall be allowed admission on such higher available option. The candidate who does not remain present during the readjustment (reshuffling) process, the admission granted to such candidate during previous counseling shall continue.
- (13) In case of any doubt, the interpretation with regard to this rule, the decision of the Admission Committee shall be final.
- 17. Fee.-** (1) A candidate who gets admission shall, at the time of admission, pay such fee as may be determined by the Fee Regulatory Committee, constituted under section 9 of the Act.
- (2) In case the candidate who having paid the fees after getting admission gets his admission cancelled, provided that the seat vacated by him is filled by another candidate, shall be paid back the fees paid by him after the completion of admission process.
- (3) In case the candidate who having paid the fees after getting admission and gets his admission changed in another course and/or College or Institution in the readjustment (reshuffling) process, the difference of fees, if any, shall be payable by the student at the time getting admission in the readjustment (reshuffling), or as the case may be, shall be refunded to him after the completion of admission process.
- 18. Change of Course or Institution.-** Except as provided in these rules, no candidate shall, after getting admission, be allowed to change his course, or as the case may be, College or Institution in any circumstance.
- 19. Documents to be Attached with the application.-** (1) The candidate shall attach the self-attested copies of the following documents with the application form, namely:-
- (i) S.S.C. Examination (Std. 10th) Mark-sheet, and passing certificate,
 - (ii) H.S.C. Examination (Std. 12th) Mark-sheet,
 - (iii) Gujarat Common Entrance Test (GUJCET) Mark-sheet,
 - (iv) School Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate, Caste certificate for a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Socially and Educationally Backward Class (SEBC), issued by the authority empowered by the Government in this behalf,
 - (v) Non Creamy Layer (NCL) certificate of the family, issued after 1st April of the relevant academic year, by the authority empowered by the Government in this behalf,
 - (vi) Certificate of Physical Disability, issued and duly signed by the medical board constituted for the purpose
 - (vii) Such other certificates as the Admission Committee deem necessary:
- Provided that the candidate shall have to produce for verification, at the time of counseling, before the Admission Committee, the original certificates and testimonies of the documents attached with the application:

Provided further that the Admission Committee may retain any original certificate and testimony of the documents, which it considers necessary until the admission process is completed. The said certificate or testimony shall be handed over by the Admission Committee to the College or Institution, where the student has got admission, after completion of admission process. Such College or Institution shall return the original certificate or testimony to the student.

(2) The candidate who is unable to submit original certificates and testimonies necessary for the purpose of admission at the time of counseling, may be granted provisional admission, subject to following conditions, namely:-

- (i) On payment of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand) as security deposit by the student. If the student submits the required documents within a period of ten days, the remaining amount of the security deposit shall, after deducting Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five hundred) towards the administrative expenditure, be refunded,
- (ii) In the event of failure to submit original certificates and testimonies within the time limit as aforesaid, the provisional admission may be cancelled and the security deposit may be forfeited,
- (iii) The student shall not be required to pay the security deposit referred to in clause [i], who has secured admission in other College or Institution and submitted his original certificates and testimonies there, provided that the student produces the proof of having taken the admission in other College or Institution and submit the undertaking to the effect that he will get his admission cancelled in that other College or Institution.

20. *Ineligibility for admission on production of false documents.*- During verification of documents, if the Admission Committee finds any certificate or testimony or information submitted by any candidate, incorrect or false, the candidature of such candidate shall be cancelled for that year and he shall be disqualified for admission for the period of next two years.

21. *Cancellation of Admission and Refund of Fee.*- (1) In case of cancellation of admission or transfer of students by the Admission Committee, due to administrative reasons, the College or Institution in which the candidate was granted admission shall refund the amount of fee collected by it, to such candidate.

(2) In case of cancellation of admission due to failure of candidate to get himself registered within the specified time limit, as prescribed in sub-rules (8) and (9) of rule 16, and subject to the condition of such vacated seat being filled up by the Admission Committee, the fees collected from such candidate shall be refunded after completion of the admission process.

(3) (a) In case of a candidate withdrawing his candidature before completion of admission process, for any reason whatsoever, he may request in writing to the Admission Committee for such withdrawal. In such case, the fee collected, if any, by the Admission Committee shall be refunded to such candidate, subject to the condition of such vacated seat being filled up by the Admission Committee,

(b) In case of a candidate withdrawing his candidature after completion of admission process, for any reason whatsoever, he may request in writing to the College or Institution in which he is granted admission, for refund of fee paid by him. In such case the fee shall be refunded, by such College or Institution, as per the directions of the Admission Committee.

- 22. Vacant Seats-** After the completion of admission process or offering admission to all the candidates whose names appear in the merit list, if the seats remained vacant, such vacant seats shall be displayed on the official *web-site*, on notice board of the office of the Admission Committee and the same may be intimated to the concerned Colleges or Institutions. In case any student requires admission on such vacant seats he shall apply directly to the concerned Colleges or Institutions. Such seats shall be filled by giving priority to the students of Gujarat State. The concerned Colleges or Institutions shall carry out admission process for such seats by maintaining *inter-se* merit of the applications received by them.
- 23. Admission to Unaided Colleges or Institutions-** (1) The Management Seats may be filled, by the management of the respective unaided Colleges or Institutions based on the *inter-se* merit list of the students whose names appears in the merit list prepared by the Admission Committee.
- (2) The admission process for filling up of Management Seats shall be carried out by the management of the respective unaided Colleges or Institutions in accordance with the procedure as may be determined by the Admission Committee.
- (3) On request of the management of unaided Colleges or Institutions, the vacant Management Seats shall be filled up by the Admission Committee provided such request is made by the management before the commencement of admission process.
- (4) The unaided Colleges or Institutions shall collect the fees, as may be determined under the provisions of the Act, by the Fee Regulatory Committee, constituted under section 9 of the Act.
- 24. Penalties-**
- The Dean / Principal of the concerned College will be responsible for admissions and appropriate collection of fees and the Registrar of the concerned University will be responsible for enrollment of candidates. It shall be the duty of the Dean / Principal and the Registrar to follow and implement the directions given by the Admission Committee. The Committee is empowered to call Dean / Principal / Registrar for the purpose of admissions. Whichever Trust / Institutions contravenes any of the provisions of these rules shall be punishable with fine which may extend to rupees twenty lakhs and / recommend punitive actions against the Dean / Principal and / or recommend deregistration of the Institution by the Council / University for academic purposes.
- 25. Interpretation.-** In implementation of the provisions of these rules, if any difficulty or question arises as to the interpretation of any provision, the decision of the State Government shall be final.
